## **Speaker Biographies**

Alix Olson Sustainable Forestry Initiative

Alix Olson is focused on supporting the development of the new SFI Urban and Community Forestry Sustainability Standard. As part of SFI's urban and community forestry team, Alix works to increase the resiliency and sustainability of communities, both large and small. She is passionate about urban forestry and creating sustainable standards for the forest sector. Before joining SFI, she worked as a tree specialist at a nursery, a landscape technician for the City of Edmonton, and was part of the environmental team at the District of North Vancouver. Alix holds a Bachelor of Urban Forestry from the University of British Columbia and is pursuing an Environmental Management Certificate from the University of Calgary. Wenxi Liao University of Toronto

Wenxi Liao is a 4th-year Ph.D. Candidate (direct entry) in Forestry and Civil Engineering at the University of Toronto. Her research focuses on applications of novel substrate additives, such as biochar, to improve hydrological and vegetation performance on green roofs. The objective of Wenxi's research is to build resilient and sustainable green infrastructure to solve environmental problems resulting from urbanization and climate change.

Melissa is currently employed as a seed biologist at the National Tree Seed Centre in Fredericton while working towards a Master of Forest Science degree at the University of New Brunswick. Melissa's prior experience includes nursery production and seed orchard management in Southern Ontario, propagation and sampling for Species at Risk recovery programs, training at the Millennium Seed Bank in England, and a diploma from the Niagara Parks School of Horticulture. She is currently a Director with the Canadian Forest Genetics Association, Editor of the Tree Seed Working Group News Bulletin, and a new member of the Canadian Institute of Forestry Maritimes Section. In her spare time, she enjoys gardening, hiking, camping, cooking, and restoring old farmhouses.

Elizabeth Celanowicz Forests Ontario

Elizabeth (Liz) graduated from York University's Environmental Studies program in 2007 specializing in Resource Management while also working internationally assisting in initiatives to preserve rainforests, educate communities on environmental sustainability and increase overall biodiversity. Since graduating, Liz has worked in the forest restoration field having spent 12 years with Toronto and Region Conservation Authority overseeing their tree planting program, managing over 30 staff, engaging with landowners and directly establishing healthy forests. Liz started with Forests Ontario in the fall of 2019 as Operations Manager and was promoted to Chief Operating Officer in 2020 and has been instrumental in the overall growth of Forests Ontario's restoration programs.

Emily Posteraro Invasive Species Centre

Emily Posteraro is a Program Development Coordinator at the Invasive Species Centre (ISC). She holds a Master of Environmental Science degree from the University of Toronto, Scarborough, where she specialized in conservation biology. One of Emily's main areas of focus at the ISC is educating industry stakeholders and the public about the invasive spotted lanternfly. Through this preventative work, she aims to help protect Ontario forests, vineyards, and orchards from a highly destructive plant pest.
