Residential Worker Mamisarvik Healing Centre Full-time, Sessional Term Contract ending December 2013

Tungasuvvingat Inuit (TI) is seeking a responsible and energetic person to provide residential support and program services to clients at the Mamisarvik Healing Centre. The Mamisarvik Healing Centre offers an eight-week addiction and trauma treatment program for Inuit. Please note that this employment involves short periods of lay-off between treatment sessions.

General Responsibilities:

- Provide supervision and emotional support to residential clients
- Facilitate co-operative living and conflict resolution amongst residents
- Support residents to follow house rules and policies
- Respond to emergency/crisis situations
- Intervene as required to de-escalate conflicts and crises by helping to resolve disputes in a solution-focused way
- Deliver recreational programming
- Some teaching of life skills e.g., cleaning, cooking, personal hygiene etc. may be necessary.
- Perform/supervise housekeeping duties and meal preparation
- Perform building security duties
- Complete shift routines as directed by Operational Procedures
- Maintain shift exchange form
- Document as needed in shift exchange binder, client individual notes, incident reports, etc.

Qualifications:

- Social Service Worker diploma/degree OR significant related work experience
- Knowledge of issues related to addictions, trauma, residential schools and relocation
- Knowledge of Inuit culture and values
- Excellent crisis-intervention and decision making skills.
- Fluent in English
- Fluency in Inuktitut is a strong asset
