14	Sarah Overvelde Housing Coordinator, Options Bytown Joyce Lundrigan Housing Support Worker, Options Bytown	Options Bytown recognizes the therapeutic benefits of pets in helping individuals who face social isolation and other complex challenges. This talk will focus on a <b>unique partnership with the Community Veterinary Outreach Program,</b> working together to help with the social isolation of clients and care for their pets.		
15	Christina McNeill Addictions Services Initiative (ASI) Worker, Homelessness Outreach Team Wabano Centre for Aboriginal Health	The presenter will share tools and interventions that have proven successful in <b>supporting Aboriginal clients struggling with mental health, addictions and homelessness issues</b> . The Wabano outreach team incorporates teachings from the medicine wheel and other traditional Aboriginal teachings into interventions in order to connect with clients, reconnect them to their community, and motivate them in a culturally safe manner. The presenter will also share insights on the City of Ottawa Addictions Services Initiative.		
16	Daniel Power John Howard Society of Ottawa	This Talk will explore the <b>John Howard Society of Ottawa's Support in Social Housing</b> , an intensive case management program for males who are chronically homeless and experiencing mental health and/or substance use challenges. Clients have also been involved with the adult justice system. The program offers a RGI apartment with OCH and the supports required to maintain tenancies.		
17	Natalie Elliot Co-Manager of Operations Operation Come Home	Since 1971, <b>Operation Come Home</b> has been working with street-involved youth in Ottawa and across the country to help them reach their highest potential. The Talk will focus on Operation Come Home's mission and mandate in Ottawa's downtown.
