
## Safe, Supportive, Affordable Housing



A Different Street is for young men 16 years of age and older who are at risk or already involved in the youth justice system, and are homeless or living in an unsafe, unstable environment.

The primary objective of A Different Street is to provide young men with a safe, stable and affordable living environment that includes comprehensive on-site support. Through these supports, they are assisted in actively addressing their personal, social, educational, vocational, and health-related needs.

A partnership between the John Howard Society of Ottawa and youturn agency enables resources of both agencies to come together to better serve the needs of the young men who live at A Different Street.
