



## Municipal Election October 2014

*With your one vote, you can make a difference!*

### Why vote:

To select the Mayor, a City Councillor for your ward, and a school board Trustee that will represent you and the issues you care about.

### Who can vote:

- a resident of the City of Ottawa, or an owner or tenant of land in the City, or the spouse of such an owner or tenant;
- a Canadian citizen;
- at least 18 years old; and
- not prohibited from voting by law

### Voting is easy:

Simply go to your voting location with your voter notification card or bring a piece of ID as proof of your name and your residency. See possible ID's at [www.ottawa.ca/voterID](http://www.ottawa.ca/voterID) or call Elections Office at 613-580-2660.

### When and Where to Vote:

Visit [www.ottawa.ca/vote](http://www.ottawa.ca/vote) and type in your address to know your voting location. Or if you are registered, see the voter notification card you will receive in the mail.

**Voting Day, October 27, 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.**

### Advance Vote Polls, depending on where you live.

October 9, 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.

October 18, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

### Or vote at any of the three Special Advance Voting locations, open to all eligible voters all three days at all three locations:

October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> - 8 a.m. to 8 p.m

- Ottawa City Hall, Jean Piggott Place
- Ben Franklin Place, Room 1A
- Ottawa Public Library, Cumberland Branch
