<b>Position Description</b>			
<b>JOB PURPOSE:</b> Participate as part of a team providing outreach services for homeless in Ottawa. The focus of the service is to provide transportation to homeless to appropriate safe shelter as well as meeting needs where the clients are.			
<b>RESPONSIBILITIES:</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• connect and engage with homeless individuals where they are physically, emotionally and spiritually</li> <li>• provide mobile on-site assessments including provision of outreach supplies, referrals and transportation to safe shelter</li> <li>• provide intervention services in the event of crisis and contact appropriate authorities when necessary</li> <li>• refer clients to other outreach and services as appropriate</li> <li>• log all contacts and notation of service provided: prepare written report following each shift for follow-up</li> <li>• be supportive of a team effort in all aspects of the Street Outreach Service: this includes all safety issues</li> <li>• ensure that the outreach vehicle is stocked with basic needs/supplies prior to conducting outreach activities</li> <li>• when required outreach may be conducted by one self during daylight hours with cell phone, backpack, logbook with regular check-ins</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• relevant post-secondary education in social services with training in harm reduction, addiction and mental health service or equivalent work experience</li> <li>• two years' experience in direct client service with the homeless, ideally in an outreach setting</li> <li>• certification in Non-Violent Crisis intervention, First Aid, Suicide Intervention preferable</li> <li>• valid Class G driver's license</li> <li>• excellent inter-personal skills</li> <li>• excellent oral and written skills in English</li> <li>• bilingualism (English and French) is an asset</li> <li>• clear Police Records Check for Service with the Vulnerable Sector is required</li> </ul>
