Shepherds of Good Hope is looking to add to its dynamic team of employees! Are you passionate about helping others? Are you interested in learning about leading-edge harm reduction programming? Want to gain experience in the social service field? Shepherds of Good Hope is hiring casual staff to work in our Transitional Emergency Support Program and Triage program. These specialized programs support high acuity adults, many of whom have difficulty maintaining shelter elsewhere. This position requires respect for, and experience working with, individuals who face barriers to service due to mental health, substance use, and trauma. Applicants should have demonstrated crisis/conflict management experience, problem-solving abilities, and deescalation skills.

Joining the team as a casual employee also provides access to frequent internal postings for regular part time and full time positions with a comprehensive group benefits package. There are consistent opportunities to cross-train into other diverse programs and departments that interest you.

- Provide support to high acuity clients, including provision of basic needs, crisis intervention, engagement and referrals.
- Establish professional relationships that respect the dignity and individuality of each client and staff member.
- Support clients through the maintenance of a clean and sanitary environment in accordance with the needs of the program.
- Follow program procedures for distribution of medication and other supplies.
- Effectively utilize communication systems to convey client and program related information.
- Engage in client advocacy.
- Work both independently and as a member of the team
- Work collaboratively with partnering agencies.
- Demonstrate knowledge of and ability to carry out all safety requirements and emergency procedures.
- Additional duties as required.
